Europa League Trip

12 student's from the Martin Gray Football Academy were fortunate enough to be given the opportunity to attend the Manchester United v FC Midtjylland Europa League match at Old Trafford. There was tension around the stadium as Man Utd returned from Denmark looking to overturn a 2-1 defeat in the first leg the previous week. Man Utd started brightly but it was the visitors that shocked the 'Theatre of Dreams' by taking the lead, extending the aggregate score to 3-1. This stirred Utd into life and they were soon level on the night thanks to an own goal. Shortly after they were awarded a penalty and it looked like the aggregate score would soon be level. However Juan Mata saw his spot kick saved and the score remained 1-1, 3-2 on aggregate. There was still time for the excellent Memphis Depay to cap off a great individual performance with a stunning 5th goal meaning the final score was Manchester United 5-1 FC Midtjylland, 6-3 on aggregate, seeing Utd comfortably in the end qualify for the last 16 of the competition. 12 tired students and 1 tired member of staff made their way back to the minibus to return home having witnessed an exciting game of football.
